

Allocated Funding: £238,000

For the academic year 2016/17, Perry Beeches II The Free School will receive approximately £238k. The allocation of Pupil Premium is currently under review. This is the school's first full year, offering education to Year 7 through to Year 13.

The success of the impact of last year's strategies have led many of the decisions for funding this year. Students who are identified as Pupil Premium will continue to be a focus of the school, ensuring that we work towards removing the achievement gap. Additional resources will continue to be offered, whilst also ensuring that a wide range of enriching activities help inspire and guide.

The funding will be carefully targeted to ensure that the additional money benefits Pupil Premium students.

Perry Beeches II – Continued growth of Accelerated Reader

We will continue to grow our literacy programme, looking to invest in Kindles to speed the process of Accelerated Reader with students.

Summer School

As always during the Summer Holidays, our students who were joining us in September are invited to a free summer school, which provides an excellent opportunity for students to get to know each other, and make new friends – key for some of our students who join us as the only student from their existing primary school. The week has a number of activities, which helps our students be comfortable with the start of their time with us here at Team PB2.

Pupil Premium money was also used to purchase resources for the Summer School.

Year 7 PGL residential

All Year 7 students will attend a one week education and outdoor residential. We believe this to be an essential part of Year 7's curriculum, as it aids their social skills and their teamwork with peers – key to help cohesion between a year group that is made up of students from over 30 different primary schools.

Year 10 Residential

For the second time, we intend to run the residential Ski trip to the Alps. We are proud to be able to offer this as a residential, as it opens up some of our students to a life changing enrichment. Students will work closely to master the skills of Skiing, whilst building relationships with a number of schools who also go to the resort.

Breakfast Club

Each day, a number of our students take advantage of our Breakfast Club, this is subsidised for our Pupil Premium students.

School Uniform and PE Kit

As a standard we expect impeccable uniform from our students – this includes blazers, ties, shoes and PE Kit.

School Equipment

Pupil Premium will be used to purchase stationary and equipment for some students.

School Educational Visits

Pupil Premium will also be used to subsidise the cost of educational visits and enrichment trips for some of our Pupil Premium students. At the time of planning, some of the trips have yet to be finalised, though will certainly include theatre trips.

Assistant Teachers

Perry Beeches II will use Pupil Premium to invest in additional Assistant Teachers, who provide additional support in lessons and lead on small group work with a focus on literacy and numeracy. There will be a specific focus on ensuring our Y11 cohort make the grades they need for the foundations of a successful life.

Attendance and Welfare Officer

We still strongly believe that students' progress hinges on their outstanding attendance. In order to raise attendance and ensure the right levels of support are shared, our Attendance and Welfare officer, will focus on the attendance of Pupil Premium students.

Revision Guides

To ensure that students are fully supported, a range of study guides will be made available for students in the library.

Student Support Team

A newly developed team will ensure that the most vulnerable students get the support they need. Within this team will be a raised focus on our Pupil Premium cohort.

Additional activities and resources for Children Looked After (CLA)

Pupil Premium funding will be used to support activities in Summer Break for CLA.

External Agencies

Pupil Premium will be used to engage with external agencies where appropriate to support PP students with their often complex needs, such as the Malachi Trust.

University Trip

To raise aspirations, our Year 10 and 11 Students will visit a university. Whilst there they will meet current students and gain an understanding of University. All of our KS4 PP students will attend this trip.

Easter/Whitsun/Feb Half Term School

To ensure that students who do not make the expected progress, intensive workshops will occur during the school holidays. Pupil Premium funding will support the purchase of resources for this intervention.
